Dear Parishioners...

In the First Letter to the Corinthians, Paul speaks of the gifts of the Spirit, he says that they have been distributed by God among many so that no one can boast. We need each other because no one fully possesses the richness of the Spirit. The key is not to call anything "my own", may it be material or spiritual. The idea of putting everything you are and have at the service of the community above yourself is primordial. The just distribution depended on the apostles; the faithful administrators placed at the head of the community by the Lord himself.

The poor of all times and of all places have been, and continue to be, those who aspire to the just redistribution of all kinds of wealth. The first Christian generations were made up from the socioeconomic point of view, by the poor and marginal segments of society. In Jerusalem, many of them were Galileans who - as migrants in Jerusalem - must have had very difficult days. They survived thanks to the mutual help that they were able to create and establish with each other. Paul organized a large collection among the richest and wealthiest communities, for the poorest and most needy communities.

In our Church we maintain this very healthy tradition to collaborate in the same way with our brothers in Christ who are in greater need and at less disadvantage than us. It is very usual for us to take a second collection. This is how we collaborate with social justice and the redistribution in equity of goods and resources. The social doctrine of the church is born from the life and preaching of Jesus, the Christ, the Son of God. We have come to faith because others have shared that testimony with us. They preached Jesus to us by establishing a new Covenant that had the Beatitudes as a Magna Carta. He spoke to us of a Merciful God who seeks an encounter, establishes a community and encourages sharing. Because no one can conceive of himself, if not by the work of others, no one, by himself can conquer his own salvation. Shared faith, the Word and the Sacraments build the Church. They make us members of a historical community with those who were credited witnesses of the resurrection of Jesus. It is up to us today that the Word continues spreading, that the seed be fruitful.

Estimados feligreses...

En la Primera Carta a los Corintios, Pablo habla de los dones del Espíritu dice que han sido distribuidos por Dios entre muchos para que nadie se jacte y nos necesitemos los unos a los otros, porque ninguno solo posee en plenitud la riqueza del Espíritu. La clave está en no llamar propio a nada de lo que se tenga, sea material o espiritual. La idea de poner todo lo que se es y se tiene al servicio de la comunidad por encima de uno mismo es primordial. La distribución justa dependía de los apóstoles, los administradores fieles puestos al frente de la comunidad por el mismo Señor. Los pobres de todos los tiempos y de todos los lugares han sido, y siguen siendo, los que aspiran a convertir en realidad el sueño de la justa redistribución de todo tipo de riquezas. Las primeras generaciones cristianas estaban conformadas, desde el punto de vista socioeconómico, por los segmentos pobres y marginales de la sociedad. Buena parte de ellos eran galileos que -como migrantes en Jerusalén- lo debieron de pasar bastante mal. Sobrevivieron gracias a la ayuda mutua que entre ellos fueron capaces de crear y establecer. Pablo organizó una gran colecta entre las comunidades más ricas y pudientes, para las comunidades más pobres y necesitadas.

En nuestra Iglesia mantenemos esta muy sana tradición para colaborar de la misma manera con nuestros hermanos en Cristo en más necesidad y desventaja que la nuestra. Es así como colaboramos con la justicia social y la redistribución en equidad de bienes y recursos. La doctrina social de la iglesia nace de la vida y predicación de Jesús, el Cristo, el Hijo de Dios. Nosotros hemos venido a la fe porque otros nos han compartido ese testimonio. Nos predicaron a Jesús estableciendo una nueva Alianza que tuviera a las Bienaventuranzas por carta magna. Nos habló de un Dios Misericordioso que busca un encuentro, establece una la comunidad y anima a compartir. Porque nadie puede concebirse a sí mismo, si no es por obra de otros, nadie, por sí mismo. Nadie puede conquistar su propia salvación. La fe compartida, la Palabra y los Sacramentos construyen la Iglesia, nos convierten en miembros de una comunidad histórica en la que, gracias al testimonio de los que fueron testigos acreditados de la resurrección de Jesús. A nosotros nos corresponde hoy que esa palabra no se calle, que esa semilla no quede infructuosa.

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
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Jesus, I Trust in You!
