Sunday of the Word of God

On September 30, 2019, on the liturgical memorial of St. Jerome, Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. We invite you to visit our Parish website to read the entire Apostolic Letter, "Aperuit illis: Instituting the Sunday of the Word of God". We also invite you to choose a book of the Bible to read over a period of time, the Sunday Mass readings, or a Bible study book. Then follow the five stages of the ancient practice of Lectio Divina to guide you.

1. READING: Read the verses aloud, slowly and carefully, realizing that God is speaking through the sacred text. Imagine the scene, notice the feelings evoked by the text, and consider the type of writing used by the author. If done in a group, members share with the others what they have discovered in the text.

2. MEDITATION: Considering what particular phrases or images have caught your attention, ask yourself what the text is saying personally to you. What insight, comfort, or challenge is God offering you? If in a group, feel free to share your thoughts with the others.

3. PRAYER: Respond to God who has spoken to you in the text. In words of thanks, praise, repentance, or petition, speak to God from the heart. In a group, this could be prayed aloud or in silence.

4. CONTEMPLATION: Simply rest in God's presence. Trust God to work within you and form you in the divine image. Stay in silence and savor the Holy Spirit.

5. ACTION: Determine how you can turn your prayerful reflection into practical experience. Let the power of God's word have an effect in your life, making you a more committed disciple of Jesus. © Catholic Initiatives



Dear Parishioners:

Let's talk about the Church Fathers, Early Church Fathers, Christian Fathers, or Fathers of the Church. They were ancient and influential Christian theologians and writers who established the intellectual and doctrinal foundations of Christianity. The historical period in which they worked became known as the Patristic Era and spans approximately from the late 1st to mid 8th centuries, flourishing in particular during the 4th and 5th centuries. You must know that some of them are considered Great Fathers in the Catholic Church and Eastern Orthodox Church traditions. They are Saint Ambrose (A.D. 340–397), Saint Jerome (347–420), Saint Augustine of Hippo (354–430) and Pope Saint Gregory I (540–604), Athanasius of Alexandria (c. 296 or 298 – 373), Gregory of Nazianzus (329 – c. 390), Basil of Caesarea (c. 330 – 379), John Chrysostom (347–407). The Apostolic Fathers were Christian theologians who lived in the 1st and 2nd centuries AD, who are believed to have personally known some of the Twelve Apostles, or to have been significantly influenced by them. Their writings, though popular in Early Christianity, were ultimately not included in the canon of the New Testament once it reached its final form. Many of the writings derive from the same time period and geographical location as other works of early Christian literature that did come to be part of the New Testament, and some of the writings found among the Apostolic Fathers' seem to have been just as highly regarded as some of the writings that became the New Testament. They are three:

- a) Saint Clement.- had been considered by some as part of the New Testament canon.
- b) Saint Ignatius of Antioch, was the third bishop of Antioch and a student of the Apostle John. En route to his martyrdom in Rome, Ignatius wrote a series of letters which have been preserved. Important topics addressed in these letters include ecclesiology, the sacraments, the role of bishops, and the Incarnation of Christ.
- c) Saint Polycarp (c. 69 – c. 155) was a Christian bishop of Smyrna (now in Turkey). It is recorded that he had been a disciple of John the Evangelist. Around A.D. 155 died a martyr. The story of his martyrdom describes how the fire built around him would not burn him, and that when he was stabbed to death, so much blood issued from his body that it quenched the flames around him.

It is important to know them because they are privileged witnesses of the tradition of the Church, they have transmitted us a theological method that is both bright and safe. Their writings offer a cultural and apostolic wealth, which makes them the great masters of the church yesterday, today and always. Next time, I will talk to you about the Greek Fathers.

Querida tía Tota:

Hablemos de los Padres de la Iglesia. Yo no soy un Padre de la Iglesia. Nos referimos con este título a los primeros teólogos de la iglesia. Llamados también los padres cristianos. Fueron antiguos e influyentes teólogos y escritores que establecieron los fundamentos intelectuales y doctrinales del cristianismo. El período histórico en el que trabajaban se conocían como la era patrística y se extienden aproximadamente a fines del 1º a mediados del siglo VIII, floreciendo en particular durante los siglos 4º y 5º.

Debes saber que algunos de ellos son considerados Los Grandes padres en la Iglesia Católica. Ellos son:

San Ambrosio (340-397 dC), San Jerónimo (347-420), San Agustín de Hipona (354-430) y el Papa San Gregorio I (540-604). Luego tenemos a Atanasio de Alejandría (c. 296 - 373), Gregorio de Nazianzo (329 - C. 390), Basilio de Cesarea (c. 330 - 379), y San Juan Crisóstomo (347-407).

Tenemos además a Los Padres Apostólicos que fueron los teólogos cristianos que vivían en el anuncio del 1º y 2º siglos, a quienes se cree que conocieron personalmente a algunos de los doce apóstoles, o que han sido significativamente influenciados por ellos. Sus escritos, aunque populares en el cristianismo temprano, finalmente no se incluyeron en la Canon del Nuevo Testamento. Muchos de los escritos se derivan del mismo período de tiempo y ubicación geográfica como otras obras de literatura cristiana temprana que llegaron a formar parte del Nuevo Testamento, y algunos de los escritos encontrados entre los Padres Apostólicos parecen haber sido igual de gran consideración. Los más representativos son tres:

- a) San Clemente.- Había sido considerado por algunos como parte importante en la definición del Canon del Nuevo Testamento.
- b) Santo Ignacio de Antioquía, fue el tercer obispo de Antioquía y un estudiante del apóstol San Juan. En ruta a su martirio en Roma, Ignacio escribió una serie de cartas que todavía se conservan porque aborda temas que incluyen eclesiología, los sacramentos, el papel de los obispos y la encarnación de Cristo.
- c) San Policarpo (c. 69 - c. 155) fue un obispo cristiano de Smyrna (ahora en Turquía). Se registra que había sido un discípulo de Juan el Evangelista. Alrededor de A.D. 155 murió un mártir. La historia de su martirio describe cómo el fuego construido a su alrededor no lo quemaba y por eso fue apuñalado hasta la muerte, tanta sangre salió de su cuerpo que apagó las llamas a su alrededor.

Es importante conocerlos porque son testigos privilegiados de la tradición de la Iglesia, nos han transmitido un método teológico que es brillante y seguro. Sus escritos ofrecen una riqueza cultural y apostólica, lo que los convierte en los grandes maestros de la Iglesia ayer, hoy y siempre.
