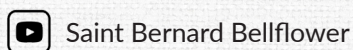
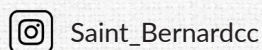

Dear Parishioners,

Don't you think that the image of Jesus Christ as King of the Universe is strange? When I think of Him being born poorly in Bethlehem, preaching to the peoples of Galilee, being captured and judged as if he were a criminal, dying for all of us on the Cross... I cannot imagine Him surrounded by luxury. The fact is that since the end of the 4th century, the Catholic Church has worshiped Jesus Christ King of the Universe, according to the image of the Apocalypse: sitting on his throne, surrounded by the heavenly court, ruling creation and watching over our lives. Well, in effect, that is what Jesus is doing right now, together with the Father and the Holy Spirit, as one God. However, knowing that Jesus is ruling the universe and watching over our lives, don't imagine him as a feudal lord ruling over his subjects, giving orders and snapping his fingers. But just as he is described in the Gospel that we have heard: mistreated and humiliated, proclaiming himself King before Pontius Pilate. Jesus as an earthly king who defeats the enemy on the battlefield, is a King who conquers sin and death. And, far from imposing his power on us, he guides his people respecting the freedom of every human being, he governs in the hearts of those who humbly wish to place themselves in his hands. The kingdom that Jesus tells Pilate about is our heart. Our hearts are the only territory where he rules. He wishes to abide in us behaving in all humility. The more we humble ourselves and annihilate ourselves before Christ, the more he becomes present in our hearts and in our lives. Saint Paul said to the Galatian Christians: "I am crucified with Christ: and it is not I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me" (Gal 2, 19-20). Like the Apostle, let us humbly let our "ego" die, so that our hearts may be ruled by one King: Christ.

Estimados Feligreses

¿No te parece que la imagen de Jesucristo como Rey del Universo es extraña? Cuando pienso en Él naciendo pobremente en Belén, predicando por los pueblos de Galilea, siendo capturado y juzgado como si fuese un malhechor, muriendo por todos nosotros en la Cruz... no me lo imagino engalanado y rodeado de lujos. El hecho es que desde finales del siglo IV, la Iglesia católica ha dado culto a Jesucristo Rey del Universo, según la imagen del Apocalipsis: sentado en su trono, rodeado de la corte celestial, gobernando la creación y velando por nuestras vidas. Pues, en efecto, eso es lo que ahora mismo está haciendo Jesús, junto al Padre y el Espíritu Santo, como un solo Dios. Sin embargo, sabiendo que Jesús está gobernando el universo y velando por nuestras vidas, no te lo imagines como señor feudal gobernando sobre sus súbditos, dando órdenes y chasqueando los dedos. Sino tal y como aparece descrito en el Evangelio que hemos escuchado: maltratado y humillado, proclamándose Rey ante Poncio Pilato. Jesús como un rey terrenal que vence al enemigo en el campo de batalla, es un Rey que vence al pecado y a la muerte. Y, lejos de imponernos su poder, guía a su pueblo respetando la libertad de cada ser humano, gobierna en el corazón de aquellos que deseamos ponernos humildemente en sus manos. Ese es el reino del que Jesús habla a Pilato. Nuestro corazón es su única grey. Desea morar comportándose con toda humildad. Cuanto más nos humillamos y anonadamos ante Cristo, más se hace presente en nuestro corazón y en nuestra vida. San Pablo decía a los cristianos de Galacia: «con Cristo estoy crucificado: y no vivo yo, sino que es Cristo quien vive en mí» (Gal 2,19-20). Como el Apóstol, dejemos humildemente que nuestro «yo» muera, para que nuestro corazón esté gobernado por un solo Rey: Cristo.
